

- Opened in Fall 2020 at near maximum capacity: Over 2,400 students (no senior class in 20-21)
- COVID Restrictions/E-Learning
- 7 AICE (AS) Level courses in year 1
- Entire staff was hired/trained at the height of the Pandemic
- Had a dedicated AICE Lead Teacher
- ▶ 940 Exam Entries

20-21: Implementation at first 4 sites




21-22: Onboarding of 13 additional high schools, and Shields Middle School
